I understand that Keith designed it this way in order to equip us with a basic understanding of the sounds and structure of the language. This is exactly what I had been looking for and I don't believe I would have found it anywhere else. As the course progressed, however, I found myself needing to develop my active knowledge and communicative competence. I believe that having greater opportunity to use the language in a productive way (such as through dialogue and peer-to-peer interaction) would have enabled me to do this, and would have enhanced my learning experience.
